<p><b>About Singapore Sports Hub</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ A state-of-the-art sporting facility designed to take Singapore's sporting ambitions to the next level</li> <li>▪ World-class venue that will be the best in the region</li> <li>▪ Developed and managed by SportsHub Pte Ltd in partnership with the Singapore Sports Council and other organisations</li> <li>▪ The Sports Hub is the largest sports facilities infrastructure Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) project in the world. <p><b>National Stadium</b></p>	<p>The new 55,000 capacity National Stadium will feature a retractable roof and comfort cooling for spectators. The canopy, which has a span of 14,000 sq m, opens and lights up in 12 minutes. It will be the centerpiece of the Sports Hub, and is strategically oriented towards the waterfront and city skyline beyond. It is a multi-functional sports facility capable of hosting numerous international-scale events such as football, athletics, rugby, cricket as well as concerts and the National Day Parade</p>
<p><b>Singapore Indoor Stadium</b></p>	<p>12,000 seating capacity which will also continue operating as the largest multi-purpose indoor facility for concerts, musicals, family entertainment and other major indoor sporting events during the construction process</p>
<p><b>Multi Purpose Indoor Arena (MPIA)</b></p>	<p>A 3,000 capacity space which will be scalable and flexible in layout, capable of accommodating indoor sporting events such as badminton, fencing, silat, wushu, gymnastics, table tennis, shooting, cue sports and others</p>
<p><b>Aquatic Centre</b></p>	<p>With a capacity of 3,000 spectators and capable of expanding to 6,000 temporary seating, the Aquatic Centre is designed to cater to elite athlete training and competition, as well as general public recreation. It will feature a 50m competition pool, 50m training pool and diving pool</p>
<p><b>Water Sports Centre</b></p>	<p>With facilities and services catering to canoeing, kayaking</p>



	and other water sports, designed to enhance offerings in the Kallang Basin
<b>Sports Information &amp; Resource Centre</b>	Comprising a library and museum
<b>Sports Promenade</b>	A wide, shady space measuring 920 sq m encircling the perimeter of the National Stadium, the Sports Promenade will be the link to all key venues of the Sports Hub while behind a destination for retail and food & beverage outlets, with views of the Aquatic Centre, MPIA and Singapore's skyline
<b>Commercial space/ retail mall</b>	Commercial space of 41,000 sq m, and a retail mall with 36,000 sq m
